Maths

ACTIVITIES

- Name and group 2D and 3D shapes (shape poster in pack)
- Practise spelling numbers to one hundred
- Find different number bonds and show in different ways:
 - On a tens frame (in pack) with counters (you can use any small objects around the home e.g. paperclips as counters)
 - On a part whole diagram (in pack)
 - As a number sentence
- Practise number bonds to 10 and 20 till they know them off by heart
- Practise working out simple addition and subtraction number sentences. To help them your child can use:
 - Number line
 - Tens frame
 - Part whole diagram
 - Drawings
 - Counting in their head
- Practise skip counting in 2s, 5s and 10s up to 100
- Practise sharing a number of objects between people
- Practise grouping a number of objects (e.g. we can fit 2 sweets in a bag. How many bags will I make?)
- Practise making number sentence families
(E.g. $2 + 3 = 5$, $3 + 2 = 5$, $5 - 2 = 3$, $5 - 3 = 2$).
To help them your child can use:
 - Tens frame
 - Part whole diagram
- Complete the mid-year revision questions (in pack)

English

TOP TIPS!

For all writing make sure your child is sitting at a table and holding a pencil properly. Make sure they always remember capital letters, finger spaces and full stops.

ACTIVITIES

- Recap all phase 2, 3 and 5 sounds (using the sound mats) – practise Use jolly phonics songs to support: <https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=26uXtUYssuo>
- Write a recount of your day
- Practice your cursive handwriting (using the handwriting lines and example words)
- Practise spelling the days of the week (in the pack)
- Practise spelling the Year 1 Common Exception Words (in the pack)
- Read a story and retell in your child's own words. Free audiobooks: <https://www.researchify.co.uk/audiobooks.html>
- Read a story and write your own version
- Write a letter to your favourite book character

- Create a story bag (find a bag and collect items to go in that relate to the story. Draw pictures for items you can't find)
- Write a postcard to a class friend or a teacher – tell us what you have been doing and what you like most about being at school

Other Subjects

SCIENCE

- Find 5 everyday objects from your home, draw them and label what the objects are, the materials they are made from, and some of the properties the different materials have
- Learn the months of the year and create an artwork about the different seasons. How do they change the weather? Which do you like best and why?

RE

- Watch videos about the Easter story and retell it by writing a story, drawing a comic strip, acting it out with toys or role playing with family members

HISTORY

- Research Queen Elizabeth II's childhood. What did she wear? What games did she play? Play some of the games she might have played and make a costume as well if you would like!
- Research Queen Elizabeth II's coronation. Watch videos of it (<https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=inKSvLk7kil>). Create a crown and role play the coronation at home. Think about: what happened? Why was it important?

PE

- Practise different ways of travelling and balancing on different body parts

DT

- Help your adult to cook a meal. Think about what is going in it and the different steps. See if you can write some instructions using words like first, next, then etc.
